- ❖ e-ID

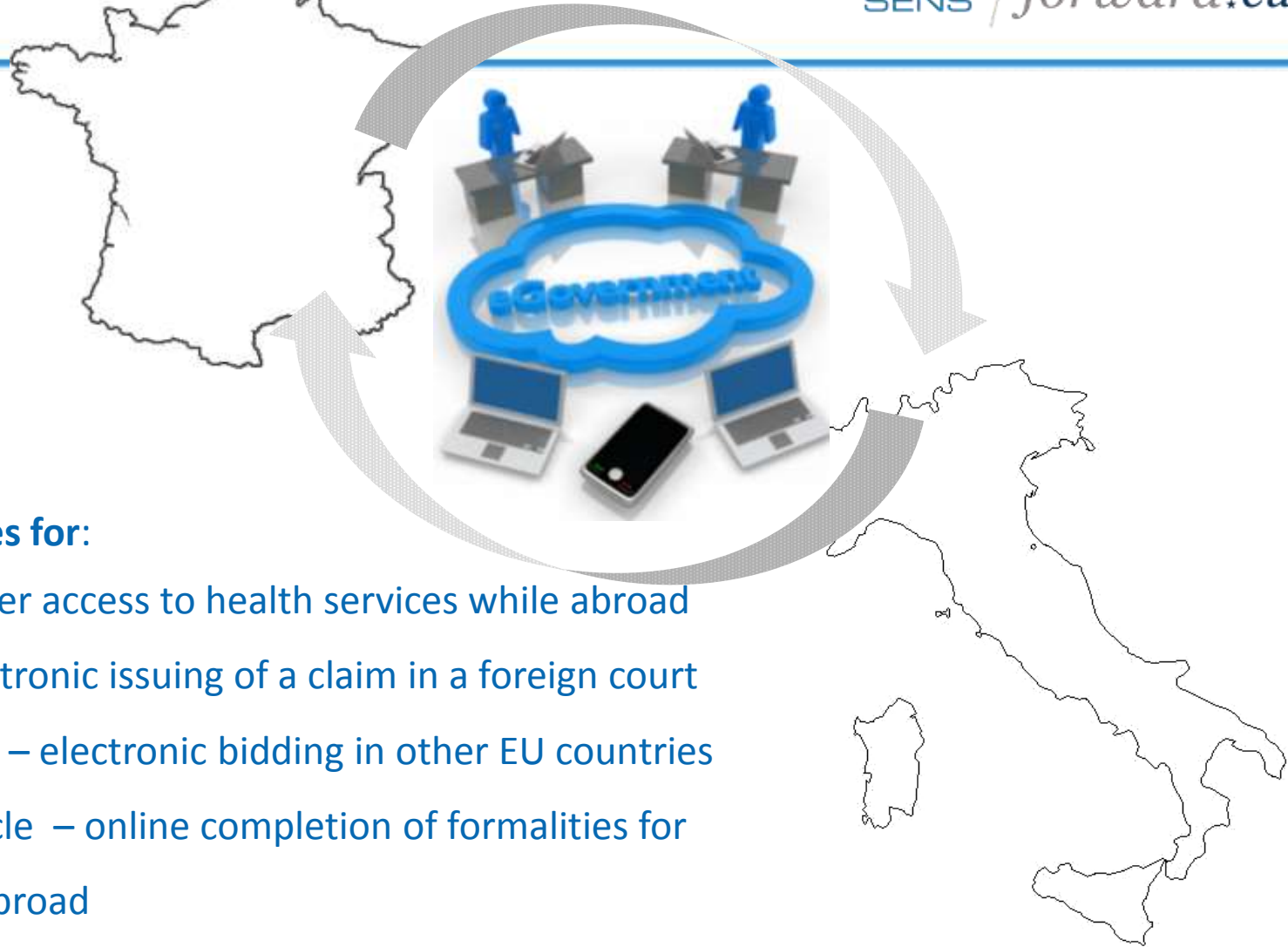


Piloting

Payload Layer

Metadata Layer

Description of the payload level files



You will be asked to provide the information describing previously uploaded files.

Security Layer

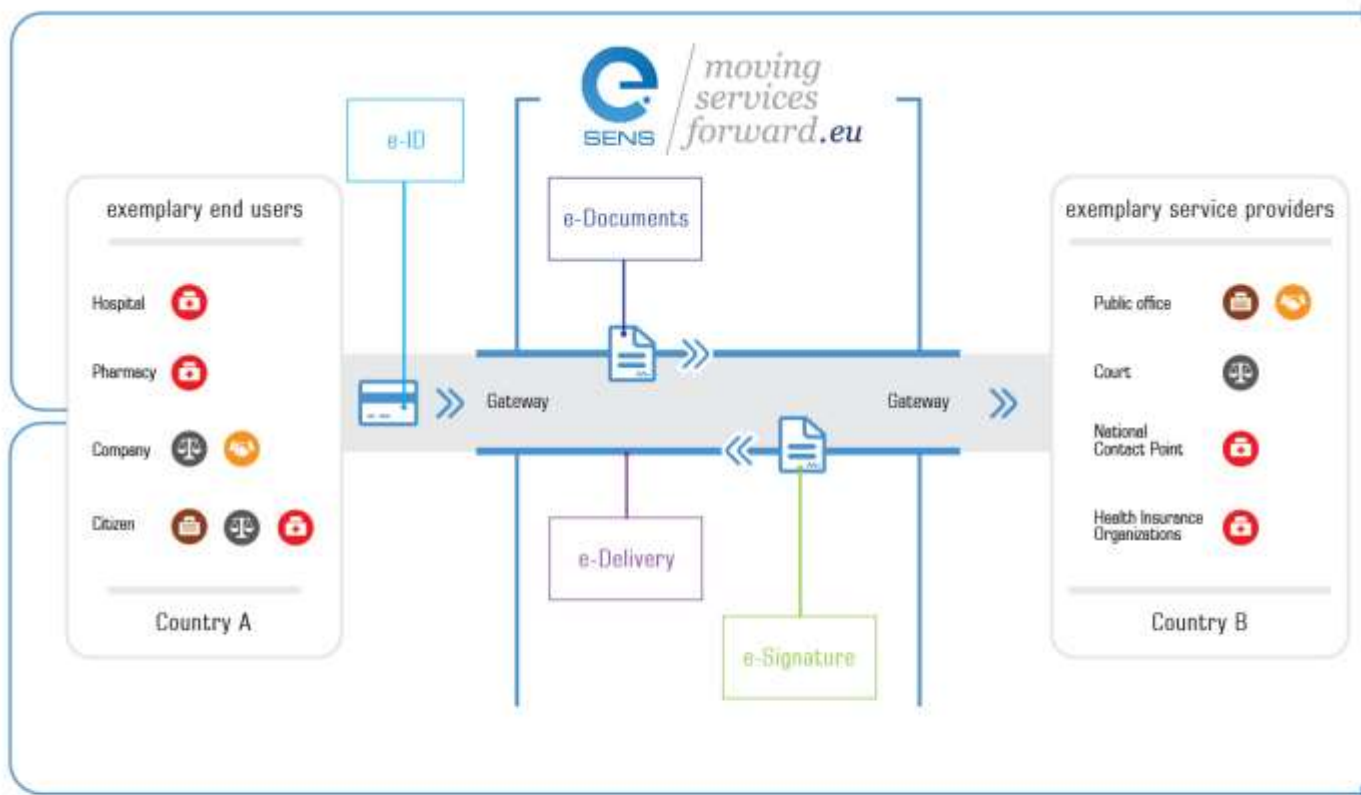
Provides data protection
